TRAFFIC ANNOUNCEMENT UPDATES FOR MRT CONSTRUCTION WORKS


KUALA LUMPUR, 26 APRIL 2017: MMC Gamuda KVMRT (T) Sdn Bhd (MGKT) wishes to announce lane closures involving roads near Chinatown, Jalan Tun Razak, Jalan Peel and Jalan Cheras. Details of the closures are as below:

1. LANE CLOSURE NEAR CHINATOWN

Location	Jalan Panggong, Jalan Sultan and Jalan Tun H. S. Lee
Date	28 April 2017 – 3 May 2017
Time	11:00 pm – 5:00 am (in stages)
Duration	6 nights
Reason	Reinstatement of road works

Lane closures will be implemented along Jalan Panggong, Jalan Sultan and Jalan Tun H. S. Lee from 28 April 2017 till 3 May 2017, to facilitate the reinstatement of road works for the Pasar Seni MRT station. The closure, affecting about 150 metres stretch on each road will be closed between 10:00 pm and 5:00 am. During the closure, one lane will remain open for traffic at all times. 2. MEDIUM-TERM ROAD CLOSURE ALONG JALAN TUN RAZAK, JALAN PEEL AND JALAN CHERAS

Location	Jalan Tun Razak, Jalan Peel and Jalan Cheras
Date	27 April 2017 - 6 July 2017
Time	11:00 pm – 5:00 am
Duration	More than 2 months
Reason	Utilities Relocation work

Night road closures will be implemented along Jalan Tun Razak, Jalan Peel and Jalan Cheras between 27 April 2017 and 6 July 2017, to facilitate utilities relocation works for the MRT Sungai Buloh-Serdang-Putrajaya (SSP) Line.

The closures will be implemented **between 11:00 pm and 5:00 am**. Please see Map 2 below on the location of the closures.
